Be sure the carving you donate has the carver's name on it and that you have it wrapped or bagged so it cannot be identified prior to the drawing. You will then be eligible to receive someone else's original carving during the exchange. If you have not taken part in the past, we encourage you to try it this year.

Remember, we will not have show and tell or a class this Saturday, just the party.


Show and Tell

Kenan Schultz carved the horse in the round from a rough out Berny gave him.



Fred Childers carved the fan bird. He will teach this class next year in June. The bird is from one piece of wood. They can be painted if you want, or left with a natural finish.






Glenn Miller carved the gentleman from a Gary Batte rough out. He carved the bottle stopper Santa from a Dale Green rough out.
