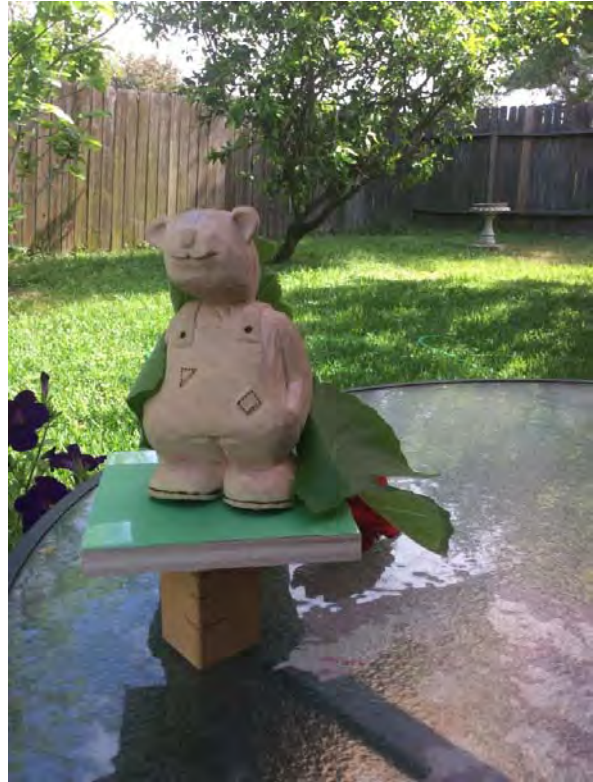
In absence of the monthly meetings, I've made phone
